#### **4. UNITED STATES HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES**

Can be approved for admission to the first level academic program (i.e.: undergraduate) in Italy on condition that:

1. They have graduated from High School and passed at least 3 Advanced Placement examinations taken with the US College Board with a score of at least 3, in subjects relevant to the program of studies to which they are applying in Italy.

If the program of studies is taught in **Italian language**, **1 of the 3 APs** required **MUST** be **AP Italian language and culture**.

Students **with Italian citizenship** who have passed AP in Italian Language and Culture **will not have** that AP in Italian Language and Culture counted toward the 3 APs requirements for admission.

The above minimum requirements will generally allow acceptance and admission to the Italian university providing that **the final two years** of High School and graduation have been attended in a US accredited High School.

If US High School graduation was attained with less than two years of attendance, the Italian University to which the student is applying will reserve the right to evaluate, case by case, the entire study program completed by the student at the upper secondary school level and determine the eligibility for admission to that University.

2. They have graduated from High School and continued their studies at College level completing at least 2 years of a four year program and gained junior standing or better, certified by the University Registrar.
3. They have graduated from High School and continued their studies at College level completing one year of a four years program and gained sophomore standing, certified by

the University Registrar + 4 APs in subjects relevant to the program to which they are applying.

Students who have graduated from High School in the United States and continued studies at higher education institutions in countries other than the United States can still apply for admission. In these circumstances the Italian University will reserve the right to evaluate the entire program the student completed in High School and in the non US college before granting admission.
